A Conversation with Special Agent Crystal Griner, U.S. Capitol Police

On Saturday, April 14, Special Agent Crystal Griner captivated a full house of over 300 women and men at the Atlantic Sands Hotel and Conference Center, in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. Crystal Griner is a special agent with the United States Capitol Police and a Women in Federal Law Enforcement (WIFLE) member. She is a recipient of the United States Medal of Valor for her courageous actions on June 14, 2017, where she saved the lives of Congressional representatives gathered at a baseball field, even while sustaining a gunshot wound from a heavily armed gunman. Special Agent Griner shared candid details about her career with the U.S. Capitol Police; the obstacles and challenges she encountered as a result of the critical incident; and the incredible support she has received from her agency, family and friends that is inspiring her to move forward as an officer, mentor and leader in law enforcement and in her community. The discussion was moderated by Margaret Moore, Chair of the WIFLE Board, and was co-sponsored by WIFLE and Camp Rehoboth Women's Fest.
